Featured Article The Man behind the Video Camera Ben Jernigan

When Ben Jernigan sees the opportunity to learn something new, "I tend to jump in with both feet" – and that's how he became the man behind the camera in the OTOW Woodshop educational videos.

Jernigan started life after college as an electrical engineer for many years at ITT Telecommunications in Raleigh, NC. He moved to Stromberg-Carlson at Lake Mary, FL, in 1986 where he managed their Test Development Engineering group. He went into quality control as a standards and safety compliance



manager. He was asked to join an international committee responsible for setting standards for quality in the telecommunications industry. He organized and led international conferences promoting best practices in telecommunications. Jernigan was honored by being named a Fellow by the QUeST Forum, the international telecommunications quality standards organization.


He attended U.S. conferences where a lot of information was shared, but not necessarily disseminated to workers. His boss gave him the green light to buy the equipment to make conference videos for the company – and as with many things he's learned in life, he found the resources to teach himself how to become a videographer.

He retired from Nokia in Lake Mary, near Orlando, about five years ago and moved to Candler Hills in 2020. Despite having a garage workshop, he joined the OTOW Woodshop and began working on educational videos.







The equipment he uses is fairly simple: a Canon video camera, the woodshop's overhead video cameras, a computer with two display screens, the editing program Pinnacle, a sound recorder, a wireless microphone and two tripods.



Jernigan mostly works with Dave Keitz, education committee chairman and past president.

"I call him one-take Dave because he's really, really good at presenting – and a very dynamic guy," Jernigan said. Together – and with a couple of other presenters – they've made 26 educational and safety videos on the woodshop's equipment.

"There's a lot of give and take, and that's how I've learned the most," he said. "Some of the things I point out are helpful to Dave, too. We play off of each other very well."

The process starts in the woodshop with tapings that can take anywhere from an hour to an entire evening. Jernigan then spends about 90 minutes editing the video and sound before posting to the woodshop page, which links to his personal YouTube site. Some of the longer and more complicated videos – such as the one on using the lathe – take him two or three days to edit.

The woodshop videos have had at least 3,000 views from YouTube subscribers and members over the past three years. Public comments on the OTOW videos have been 100 percent positive. Since he's a perfectionist, he'll often go back in two or three times for editing improvements.

To find the videos, go to OTOWwoodshop.com, scroll to the education tab and roll down to videos. The most recent ones are marked with an @. Not all of the videos are locally made; some that are appropriate to our woodshop come from other YouTube sites.

By-Laws description of duties:
